



## Digital Image Pro: Cutting Words out of Paper and Photos

This tutorial will show you how to fill text with any background or photo, resulting in a title that appears to have been cut from paper.

1. Insert and Format Text. Make sure you are happy with the text, because you will not be able to change it when you are finished.
2. Choose *Effects/Fill with Texture or Color*. Click on the *Picture* option (in DIP 9 this is an apple icon.) You will see something like this.



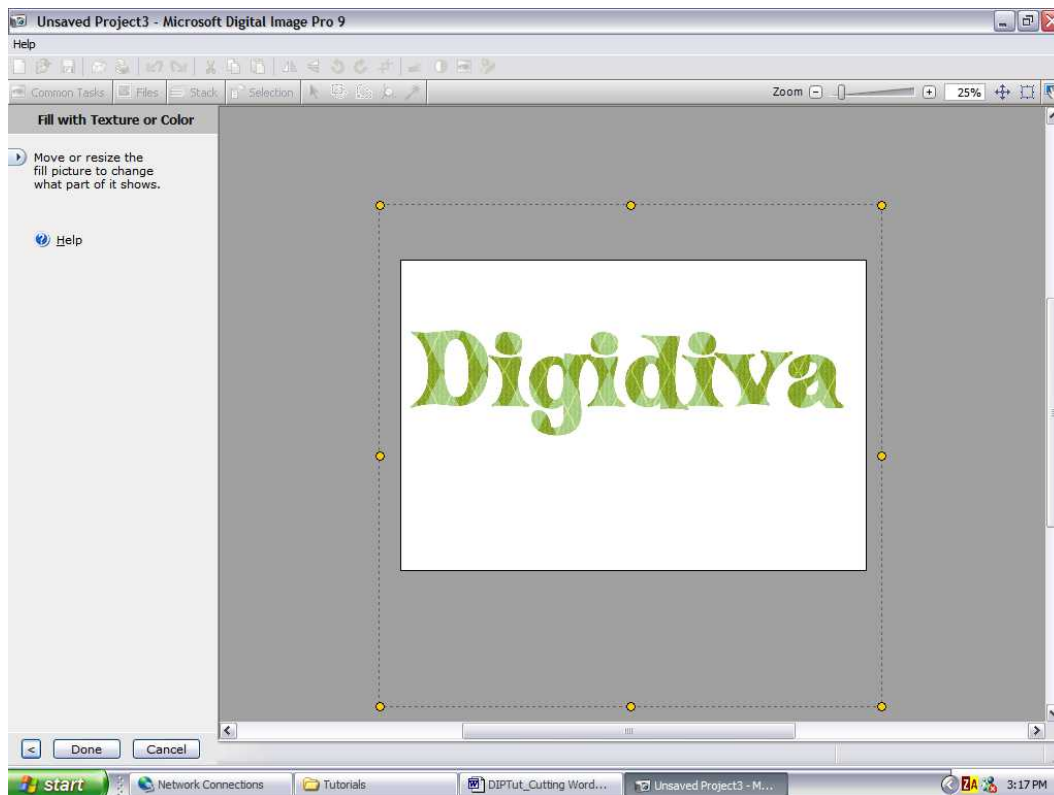
3. Now you will insert the background into the text. How you do this depends on whether or not you have the background file open in DIP.

- a. If you already have a background open with which you want to fill the text, double click it in the files stack.

OR

- b. If you do not have a background open, choose *Open a Picture*. The browser will pop up allowing you to choose the paper/photo you wish to use. Double-click it the image you want to use.

4. Now you will need to adjust the background. You can use the handles to adjust the size and shape of the background when you are happy with the result. Choose Done.



5. That's it. You should have something similar to this:
